The final proposals of the WG (based on majority voting) were submitted to the ARF Executive Committee and then to the ARF Congress in Palembang, INA, for approval in August 2018.

2. Associate Members shall be those federations which are not members of FISA and whose National Olympic Committees are not members of the Olympic Council of Asia.

Member federations may submit specific proposals or other items for inclusion in the agenda, which shall be received by ARF at least six weeks before the date of the Congress. The Executive Committee shall send to all member federations the final agenda for the Congress at least one month before the date of the Congress. Where possible, the various reports, any observations on the agenda items, the accounts, the financial report and the proposed budget shall be sent out with the final agenda. Subsequent written material may be circulated by the Executive Committee.

ASIAN ROWING FEDERATION - BYE-LAWS TO THE STATUTES		
1. Honorary Titles - Congress may grant the honorary title of their office to former office bearers who have rendered distinguished service to the cause of rowing. They shall act in an honorary capacity and may take part in deliberations, but shall have no voting rights nor any right to propose or second any motion.		
2. Administration Expenses - The general administration expenses shall be paid from the ARF account, for which the annual budget and financial statements should be reported to and approved by the Congress.		
3. Proposals from a Federation not represented at Congress and from Associate Members - Any proposal placed on the agenda of a Congress by a Federation not represented or by an Associate Member shall only be discussed if another Federation present, being a General Member, or the Executive Committee, assumes responsibility for it.		
4. Committees - The Committees established under Article 32 of the Statutes shall each comprise between four and seven members (including the Chair), in principle each from a different member federation.		
Each Committee shall provide an annual report to the Congress and any other reports as required by the Executive Committee.		
Each Committee shall in principle meet at least once a year.
